LATEST COVID GUIDANCE – Update (10.2.2022)

Whilst the legal requirements associated with Covid-19 no longer apply the Government suggests that we continue to wear a face mask when in enclosed spaces. Therefore, in accordance with this advice, Diocesan guidance and our on-going duty of care for our parishioners, we will continue to:

- Ask you to wear face masks whilst in Church – Please bring your own mask and help us to reduce costs.
- Sanitise your hands on entering the Church.
- In addition, **we ask that, out of respect for your fellow parishioners, you comply with our measures to reduce the risk of infection and to help ease the anxiety of those parishioners returning to Mass for the first time since the pandemic started.**

HOWEVER, with effect from Monday 14.2.2022, in line with Government and Diocesan guidance, we will:

- Not be providing any social distancing measures. All benches will be available, and stewards will no longer seat parishioners.
- Be reusing Mass sheets, newsletters and hymn books will not be restricted to specific Masses.
- Not be sanitising benches after every Mass.

PARISH "WALKING TOGETHER" - Please take a Questionnaire

Dear Parishioners, you may recall that before Christmas I shared with you the Archbishop's letter regarding the Pope's Synod 2021 – 2023. Synod means 'journeying together', or in Diocesan terms "**Walking Together**", and it involves listening to the Holy Spirit and to each other in order to discern the way forward. Pope Francis wants to hear from the whole Church about what is happening in local parishes and what we think we should all be doing to help make our parishes better.

The "Walking Together" process is above all a spiritual journey. We are invited to journey together as a Parish, individually and collectively to pray for the Holy Spirit to lead and guide us. "Walking Together" calls for action as a Parish, in the short term (see our Parish programme below), with our actions contributing to the work of the Synod, as it seeks to understand where we are as the Church today. This can only happen under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. There are three key concepts that shape "Walking Together":

COMMUNION: - What is it that binds us together as the Catholic Church of Christ and what is its purpose?

PARTICIPATION: - How do we engage with one another and the life of the Church in the world today?

MISSION: - What is our common mission and whose mission is it, how do we reach out to hand on the faith to others?

The Parish's "Walking Together" programme continues by praying the *Prayer for the Synod (Adsumus, Sancte Spiritus)*, see below, at all Masses during February 2022.

The parish "Walking Together" questionnaire, based on the above key concepts, is available from this weekend for you to consider in prayer and respond to in writing or by attending our Parish, Walking Together meeting, in the Parish Centre, on Thursday, 24.2.2022 at 7:30pm to 9:00pm.

In addition, the questionnaire and further information, on the format of our Parish meeting, will be available via the Parish website's Walking Together page (maryandmodwen.org.uk) from Monday 7.2.2022. All responses will be collated and a Parish response sent to the Archdiocese by 28.2.2022.
