MARCH FOR LIFE, 3 SEPTEMBER 2022: This year marks the sad milestone of 10 million abortions in the UK since the 1967 Abortion Act. MARRIAGE LAW CHANGES: In April 2022 Parliament passed legislation (Marriage and Civil Partnership (Minimum Age) Act 2022) declaring that Marriage and Civil Partnerships for those under 18 years of age is unlawful. However, the Act requires Regulations to put that ban into effect. Those regulations have not been published yet, and there is no indication when they will be. It is strongly advised that clergy do not organise Marriages for under 18's in case they fall foul of the law on the wedding day. Young prospective couples and their families planning a wedding in the Church should take note of this announcement.

THANK-YOU FR FABIAN: As already announced, on 1st September 2022 Fr Fabian will leave the parish to proceed on his sabbatical leave outside the country. Following the tradition, I have placed envelopes at the back of our Churches for show of appreciation from our parishioners for his apostolic service to the parish.
